## HONORS LEADERSHIP AND CONTRIBUTION TO ANSG

embers and supporters of the Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens (ANSG) recently gathered in the newly unveiled historic Orchid House and Plaza for a member appreciation reception and enjoyed an end of season celebration hosted by the Board of Trustees providing the opportunity to explore the many recent enhancements throughout the Gardens. Fashion icon, visionary female artist and ANSG Board Trustee member Iris Apfel; famed photographer and Artist in Residence Harry Benson CBE; and philanthropist and Board of Trustees Vice Chairwoman Sally Soter were presented with the Golden Palm Award in honor of their leadership and contributions to ANSG throughout the 2022-2023 season. The presentation took place in the newly restored Wyeth Gallery of the Norton House.

"Today I am honored to thank our members for an extraordinary season and spotlight three remarkable individuals who have been incredibly instrumental in the growth and vitality of ANSG," said **Frances Fisher**. "Iris Apfel, Harry Benson and Sally Soter have each transformed this historic treasure and tropical oasis in many ways. We are delighted by our 2022-23 Season of Culture, Deep Refreshing and Preservation and our many generous donors and members who made it all happen."

Apfel is one of the most dynamic personalities in the world of fashion, textiles and interior design. Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens had the opportunity to recognize her 97th birthday, and her 100th birthday, where she graced the Gardens with a magnificent legacy gift at that celebration. Now going on 102, she recently presented a second major gift to ANSG to name the Wyeth Gallery, in the historic *Norton House*.

Soter's involvement with ANSG began in 2014 to help form the *Gardens Conservancy* which led to a revitalization of the Board including exhibitions, programs, special events and restoration efforts. She and her husband **Bill** have been very generous with ANSG including the named gift for the *Wyeth Terrace* and the *Main Lawn* last year. They recently gifted ANSG a second transformational gift to name the historic *Orchid House and Plaza* which serves as a centerpiece for cultural, horticultural and educational programming.

Benson was the Gardens' third Artist in Residence and presented some of his most legendary photographs during *Harry Benson*

Picturing History, in partnership with Holden Luntz Gallery, JL Modern Gallery and Palm Beach Modern + Contemporary. Benson began his career in London in the early 60s. After arriving in New York with The Beatles in 1964, he never looked back. Benson began working for *LIFE* magazine and became one of its most published photographers for 30 years. His photographs have also appeared in Time, Fortune, New York Magazine, Quest, Newsweek, Vanity Fair, French Vogue, Forbes, Town & Country, Architectural Digest and The New York Times to name a few. He was even made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II for service to photography in

The Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens is a nonprofit foundation established in 1977 by resident sculptor Ann Weaver Norton (1905-1982). A two-acre urban sanctuary and internationally recognized arboretum, the compound comprises the historic *Norton House and Artist Studio*, exhibition galleries, monumental sculptures, *Pollinator Garden*, historic *Orchid House*, and tropical gardens of more than 250 species of rare palms and cycads. The Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens' mission is to enrich lives with nature, art and history.

Located at 253 Barcelona Road in the historic El Cid neighborhood of West Palm Beach, the Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens is open Wednesday through Sunday, 10am-4pm and closed on major holidays.
