Caron Treatment Centers, an internationally recognized nonprofit expert in substance use disorder treatment and recovery, held a community sneak peek event before its new **Keele Medical Center** in Delray Beach begins to accept patients in the coming weeks. The Keele Medical Center is located at 4575 Linton Boulevard in Delray Beach.

Guests gathered throughout the morning to tour the new 100,000-square-foot state-of-the-art medical facility, meet with **Caron Florida** leadership and learn more about Caron's cutting-edge programming. Special guests in attendance included **State Attorney Dave Aronberg, Mayor Gregg Weiss and Commissioner Marci Woodward**. Together, they had the honor of issuing an exciting Palm Beach County proclamation that January 13th will now be known as *Substance Use and Mental Health*

Disorder Treatment Day.

"This building and our expanded programs could not come at a more critical time," said **Dr. Phoenix Adams**, Executive Vice President, Caron Florida Programming. "The Keele Medical Center brings much-needed treatment resources for individuals struggling with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders, as well as individuals who are medically complex for whom treatment options are limited. We are proud to bring The Keele Medical Center to the community and are excited for not only the impact it will have on our patients, but also on the greater treatment sector."

The Keele Medical Center is part of Caron Florida's expansion, which also includes a recently added standalone *Mental Health Program* to address the growing need for quality mental health care. Caron Florida will continue to offer signature

programming at Caron Renaissance in Boca Raton and Ocean Drive in Delray Beach.

The Keele Medical Center will include a medical detox unit, 40 beds for residential treatment programming including an *Older Adult Program*, as well as neurocognitive services, research and medical education. It will be staffed with highly credentialed clinicians, physicians, psychologists, psychiatrists and nurses, with specialties that include integrative medicine, internal medicine, addiction medicine and chronic pain.

"Our goals for every individual struggling with a substance use disorder, especially older adults, are improved quality of life, connection, meaningful relationships and a sense of purpose," continued Adams. "We know that in recovery, these goals are attainable and likely."
