t was a pot worth stirring as the **Palm Beach County Food Bank** (PBCFB) returned with its
11th Annual *Empty Bowls Palm Beach* at Church
of Bethesda-by-the-Sea. The event gives supporters
the humble reminder "to eat simply, so others can
simply eat." Since its inception, **Bethesda-by-the-Sea** has
underwritten the event in its entirety, with overwhelming
support from the community, so that every dollar raised to
attend the event directly supports the PBCFB.

Empty Bowls is a national grassroots event that raises money for hunger relief. Guests shared a basic meal of freshly baked bread from **Old School Bakery**, signature soups donated by local chefs, water and a delectable bake sale all served by community leaders and local celebrities. This year's event Chairs were **Amy Sullivan**, **Johanna Reyers** and **Michael Dobies**.

"In the past 11 years, we have raised \$1 million in the entirety of hosting *Empty Bowls Palm Beach*," said **Jamie Kendall**, CEO of PBCFB. "Every meal is more than just food. It is children attending school with the energy and focus they need to succeed; it's senior adults holding on to their health and independence and it's families being able to pay their bills. Thanks to our valuable partners at Church of Bethesda-by-the-Sea, we can give back dignity and some peace of mind to our neighbors who are struggling with significant food insecurity."

The Palm Beach County Food Bank procures food from grocery stores, farmers, food distributors, wholesalers, and other sources to almost 200 local community partners, including food pantries, soup kitchens and residential housing programs. Palm Beach County Food Bank programs reach families, children, and seniors, and connect those in need to available benefits and resources. Partner agencies distribute the products received, including culturally appropriate food and necessities like paper towels and diapers. This process ensures families have access to food when they need it most.
