County (HSPBC), A Portrait
of Leadership, was held at
the 1916 Historic Courthouse, home of the
HSPBC's Richard and Pat Johnson Palm Beach
County History Museum. Following a cocktail
reception, local women leaders shared their
insights about representing their gender in their
varied roles. More than 140 guests attended
the free recorded event, which will appear on
Channel 20 and reside on the HSPBC YouTube
Channel.

Alexandria Ayala, who represents the School Board of Palm Beach County on the HSPBC Board of Governors, welcomed attendees, and HSPBC Board Member Mary Freitas introduced Moderator Nathalie Pozo, anchor at WPBF 25 News.

The panel included **Nancy Brinker**, Founder of Susan G. Komen and Promise Fund of Florida; **Penny Murphy**, President, Pioneer Linens; **Laurie Silvers**, Attorney, Entrepreneur, Board Chair of University of Miami and **Ethel Isaacs Williams**, Esq., Attorney and National President, The Links, Incorporated.

All of the panelists shared nuggets of wisdom:

- Ethel Williams "Philanthropy is not always money. All of us can give something back time, talent, or resources."
- Penny Murphy "To raise strong daughters, be a good role model."
- Nancy Brinker, who has the gene that took her sister's life at age 36 "You cannot let it run your life."
- Ethel Williams "Acknowledge that bias exists (against gender, race, or age). Bring the whole person to others."
- Nancy Brinker "Always raise your hand, take the hardest job, and do the best job you can. Stick with your commitments and do not let others define you."
- Laurie Silvers "To counteract the negative effects of social media, reach out and show kindness, show your heart. We are obligated to extend a hand and mentor the next generation."

in Palm Beach County and to be sitting in this Historic Courthouse. Because Richard and Pat Johnson (and others) wrote their check, the Society is able to archive all that happens here."
