The *Gala* guests were among the first to hear the world premiere of *Portraits and Diversions* by Pulitzer Prize winner **Aaron Jay Kernis**, which was sponsored by **Ambassador Bonnie McElveen-Hunter** in honor of **Judy and Leonard Lauder**. Guest artist **Emanuel Ax** brought the audience to its feet with his performance of one of Mozart's greatest concertos.
