For 14 years, Mr. Mack was Deputy Superintendent, the rank of Colonel, of the New York State Police. He is also a member of the Board of the United Nations Development Corp. of New York.

Mr. Mack received his B.A. Degree in Business Administration from Hofstra University, where he serves as a member and Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees. He is a member of the Board of Overseers of Northwell Health and a former Trustee of North Shore Hospital and Long Island Jewish Hospital System and a former member of the Board of Trustees of Pratt Institute.

In addition to his new role as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the MorseLife Health System, Mr. Mack is also on the Board of Directors of
