In November 2021, CCE announced a \$20 million capital campaign as they began renovation on the existing building located on their new campus at 2400 Metrocentre Boulevard in West Palm Beach. Opened in August 2022, the renovated building hosts **The Foundations School**, an independent elementary school that aims to break the barriers of traditional learning by integrating the arts and creativity into academic subjects.

The Spanish theme for the spring fundraiser ties into curriculum at **The Foundations School**, where third-grade students have formed a partnership with a school in Teruel, Spain. The students have exchanged postcards, created videos, and embarked on creative projects allowing them to learn about each country's unique culture and heritage.

The 22,000 square-foot *Susan and Dom Telesco Arts and Science Center* will have a 200-seat theater, an art gallery and art studios, STEM labs, a full recording studio, and community event spaces, with groundbreaking anticipated this fall.
