We want every veteran to know that they do not need to face this battle alone. Man's best friend can help."

To date, the program has delivered nearly 270 healing leashes into the hands of U.S. military veterans — at no cost to them — thanks to the generous support of donors.

With philanthropist and veteran's advocate Lois Pope serving as the Inspirational Chair of the event, and a speaker line-up that included retired Brigadier General Lorry Sutton and television host Montel Williams, attendees gave generously to support Pups4Patriots. The Dinner raised enough money to partner six new service dogs to American veterans.
